**MINISTER HOSEIN HANDS OVER LEASE TO CHINMAYA MISSION TT**

Today, the Honourable Saddam Hosein, Minister of Land and Legal Affairs and Minister in the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, led the official handover of a State lease to the Chinmaya Mission Trinidad and Tobago during a ceremony held at the Chinmaya Mission Vidyalaya in Couva.

The lease relates to approximately twelve acres of State land located at Calcutta, Couva, which will continue to support the organisation's educational and community development initiatives. The lease arrangement follows years of engagement and approvals aimed at regularising the occupation and use of the lands for educational purposes.

In delivering key remarks at the ceremony, Minister Hosein stated that the handover represents the Government's continued commitment to supporting institutions that contribute meaningfully to education, national development, spirituality, and community empowerment.

The Minister noted that the Chinmaya Mission Trinidad and Tobago has played an important role in shaping young minds and fostering positive values through its educational and spiritual programmes. He further commended the organisation for its longstanding contributions to the people of Trinidad and Tobago and its dedication to service and nation-building.
